GLASS JARS

- **NOT RECOMMENDED:** Skin care products, wash cloths



OPEN SHELVES

- **GOOD FOR:** Extra towels, toothbrush, mouthwash, shaving cream, lotion and other everyday toiletries
- **NOT RECOMMENDED:** Medications, rarely used products



BASKETS

- **GOOD FOR:** Bath linens, hair styling tools, toilet paper, reading material
- **NOT RECOMMENDED:** Products that are likely to leak, such as shampoo and skin care bottles



TRAYS

- **GOOD FOR:** Perfumes, jewelry, candles, toothbrush, contact cases, skin care products
- **NOT RECOMMENDED:** Bath linens, hair styling tools



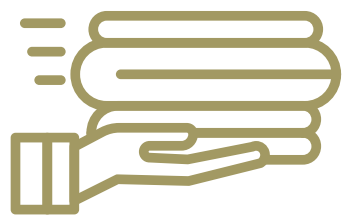
CABINETS UNDER THE SINK

DRAWERS

- **GOOD FOR:** Cosmetics, deodorant, floss, tweezers, nail files, hair styling products, grooming accessories, sunscreen
- **NOT RECOMMENDED:** Bath linens, toothbrush
